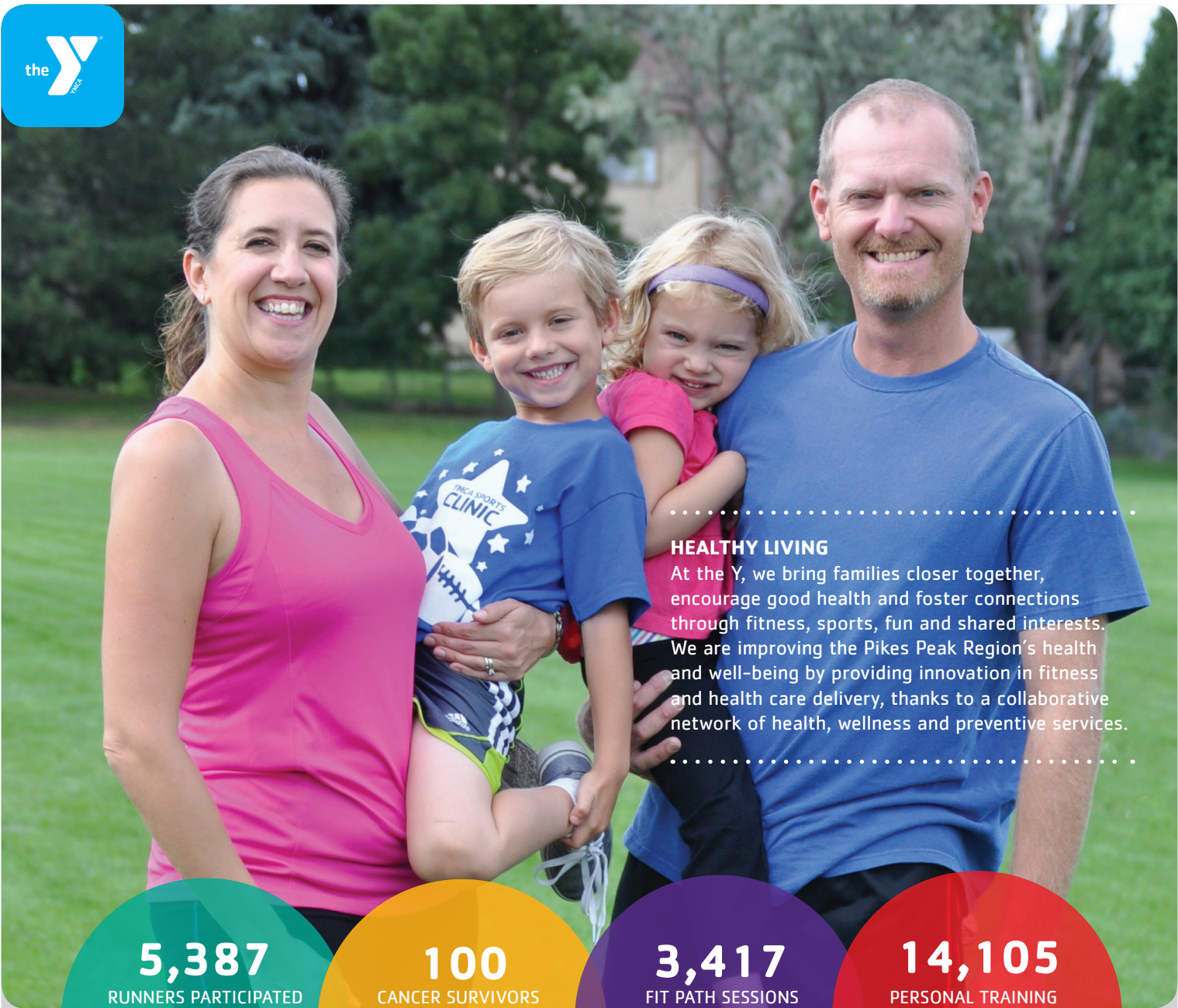

J. H. WOODGATE AWARD



TOM KENNEDY

The J.H. Woodgate Award is named for the first Board Chair of the Colorado Springs YMCA who served in 1878. Each year, our Association recognizes an individual or entity whose service or support has made a profound and lasting impact on our organization.

Tom’s role as a leader in our community has spanned decades and has had significant impact on the YMCA Metro Board, our staff and the YMCA as a whole. Tom has served on the YMCA Board for almost 10 years, including in an extended role due to the unexpected departure of a previous chair. Tom eagerly stepped in and took the helm, providing tremendous leadership and guidance.

Tom led the vision for how the Metro Board should help guide the Y and represent the voice of its members. He played a significant role in creating a governance model that inspired, educated and helped the board to operate in a more engaged level. His guidance helped to deepen the boards understanding of their role and fiscal responsibility.

Tom guided the implementation of the governance committees that work in conjunction with staff, directly affecting day to day operations; a process that continues to this day.

It was under Tom’s leadership of the board and in working with the Y that the Tri-Lake’s Health Pavilion went from a vision, to the model health care facility that it is today. This facility focuses on wellness, prevention, and helping people reach and maintain optimal health in their everyday lives.

With an understanding of the need to impact other’s lives in our community in a similar way, Tom helped lead the feasibility study for our current Capital Campaign that will have similar impact at our Garden Ranch, Eastside and the Downtown locations.

Tom’s dedication, leadership and love for this community will continue to have a lasting impact on generations to come.

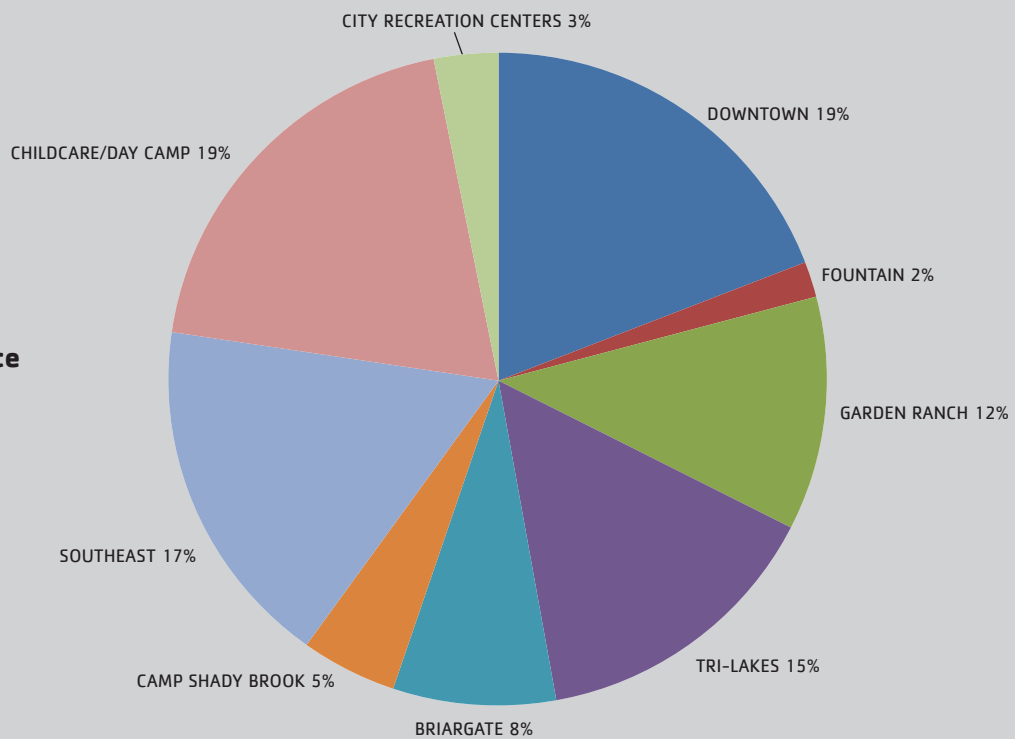

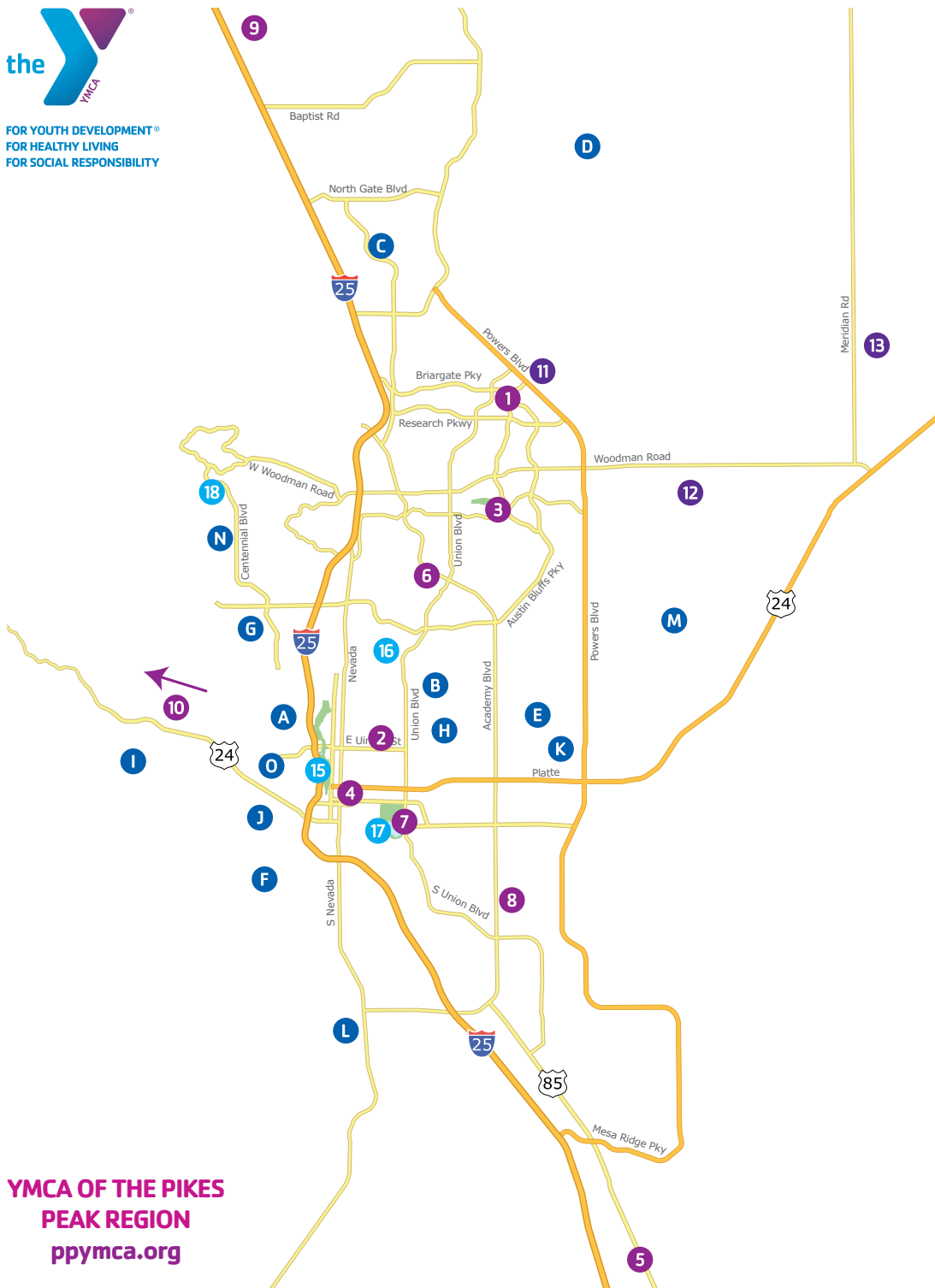
